## III. Concepts of Ifa-Orisa Practice

**Egun** is our ancestors

**Orisa** literally translates to mean "select head". Orisas are deities that are forces of nature

**Ori** can refer to a person's head. Spiritually, it is the divine spark of the creator individualized in human beings

**Divination** is process where an initiated priest consults oracles to give a person clarity into a life situation as well as if they are in alignment with their purpose and destiny
